LIEUT. W. N. RILEY WOUNDED.

Lieut. W. N. Riley, 4th Leicestershire Regiment, has been seriously wounded in France. It has been found necessary to amputate his left leg at the thigh. He has also serious injuries to his head. He is in hospital at Boulogne, and his condition is now considered satisfactory.

Lieut. Riley, who is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Riley, of Appleby Magna, is a distinguished athlete. Last year, when he was holiday tutor to young Sir Robert Peel, he played cricket in Sir Robert Peel's team at Drayton Manor.
