

DEATH OF MISS ROSAMOND MOORE.—The death has occurred, at an advanced age, at her residence, 10, Wetherby Mansions, Earls Court, London, of Miss Rosamond Moore. The deceased lady, who was born at Appleby Hall, was the third daughter of the late Mr. George Moore, J.P., D.L., of Appleby Hall, her mother being a daughter of the Rev. Charles Shuttleworth Holden, of Aston Hall, Derbyshire. Miss Moore had two brothers and three sisters. Her elder brother, Mr. George John Moore, M.A., J.P., D.L., of Appleby Hall, died in 1916; while her younger brother was the late Rev. C. T. Moore, rector of Appleby for about 45 years, and chairman of the Ashby-de-la-Zouch and Coalville Benches of Magistrates. Miss Moore's father, who held the Appleby Hall estate for over 44 years, married as his first wife Miss Susan Inge, daughter of Mr. W. P. Inge, of Thorpe Constantine, who died three years after her marriage. The Moore's owned and occupied Appleby Hall from 1599 till 1916, and for 100 years they were covert-owners and liberal supporters of the Atherstone Hunt. The late Captain J. Anstruther-Thomson, who was master of the Atherstone Hounds upon three separate occasions, wrote of Miss Moore's father, "George Moore, of Appleby, was one of my greatest friends, and one of the best judges of hounds. He had a lovely breed of pointers, and had a sale every year at Tattersall's. He used to get £50 a-piece for them, and then invited all his friends to dine at Greenwich at the 'dog dinner.' The quality of his horses was not quite so good, and old Bill Potter, the dealer at Talbot Lane, used to say 'I don't know how Muster Moore can wriggle across country on they tits.'" The funeral took place on Monday afternoon, at Brompton Cemetery.
