DEATH AND FUNERAL AFTER ACCIDENT.—On Sunday the funeral took place of Harold Gothard, who met with a serious accident while working in the Measham Main Colliery, on August 30, and who had been carefully nursed in the Leicester Infirmary till October 14, when he succumbed to his terrible injuries (fractured spine and legs by a heavy fall of coal). The inquest was held on Thursday last week, and a verdict of accidental death was returned. The family mourners were—Mr. F. Gothard (father), Mrs. H. Gothard (widow), Mrs. F. Gothard (mother) and R. Gothard (brother), Ruth and Mabel (sisters), Mr. J. Clarke and Mrs. R. Gothard (brother-in-law and sister-in-law), Mrs. E. Gothard (aunt) and Mr. F. Winter (friend and fellow workman), Amelia Buckley and Mrs. Miles (aunts), Oliver Buckley (Worthington, cousin) and Mrs. Peach (Measham, aunt), Mr. and Mrs. E. Wileman (cousins), Mary Miles (sister-in-law) and Mrs. Taft (aunt), Mrs. Taft (grandmother) and Mrs. G. Jewell (friend), and Mr. G. Jewell (friend). The Manager, Mr. G. Stevens, and Mrs. Stevens also attended, representing the Measham Colliery. The George Moore Lodge of Oddfellows, of which the deceased was a brother, was represented by Bros. A. Keites, M. Smith, J. Beadman, J. Smith, S. Bowley, V. Garratt, H. Cheshire, W. Kelsey, P. Booton. The bearers were Messrs. C. Gothard, W. Hicks, A. Gothard and J. Pointon. The coffin bore the inscription: "Harold Gothard. Died October 14, 1931. Aged 25 years." The service was taken by the Rector (the Rev. D. J. Davies). The floral tributes, some forty in number, were very beautiful.
