ARE HOUSES WANTED?—When Ashby Rural Council on Saturday discussed the question of providing houses at Appleby, the Rector of Appleby (the Rev. D. J. Davies) declared that there was no demand for houses there, and said that a meeting of villagers decided by fifty votes to ten against houses being built. He urged that houses should be built in areas where they were wanted. Mr. T. Varnam, who also represents Appleby on the Council, said he objected to paying a fivepenny rate for houses if Appleby was left out, and eventually the Council decided to erect twelve houses there.
