Matinee at 2.30pm — Refreshments available during the interval

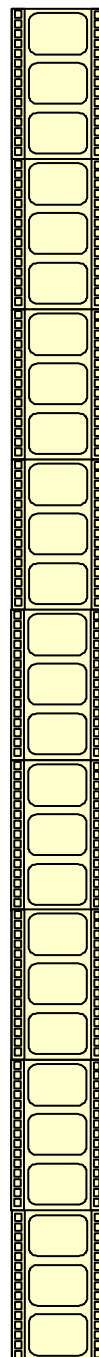
Evening at 8.00pm — No interval, refreshments served from 7.45pm

Starring: Jenifer Lawrence, John Hawkes, Garret Dillahunt

A relatively low budget independent film from America that became an Oscar contender and winner at the Sundance festival. A girl from the Ozark Mountains striving to keep her family intact while she tracks down her drug-dealing father, it's a tense and riveting drama.

Gentle and romantic comedy drama. A British investment broker inherits his uncle's chateau in Provence, where he spent much of his childhood. Pure entertainment and escapism from a consummate director and cast.

Quirky British comedy set in Swansea. 15-year-old Oliver has two objectives: to lose his virginity before he's 16, and to extinguish the flame between his mother and an ex-lover who has resurfaced in her life.

Le Quattro Volte

An old shepherd lives his last days in a quiet village high in the Calabrian hills. Quietly meditative, profoundly beautiful human story with touches of comedy, and scenery to die for.

Starring: Aleksey Guskov, Melanie Laurent, Dmitri Nazarov

Thirty years after he was fired for hiring Jewish musicians, a past conductor at the Bolshoi learns his former orchestra are to play in the theatre where he works as a cleaner. He gathers his former musicians to perform in place of the visitors. A feel good comedy drama with some virtuoso playing and a wonderful musical finale.
